HERE ARE SOME TIPS TO HELP YOU BE SUCCESSFUL.**

Manage your academic schedule. Look at your course syllabus to check exam/quiz/assignment due dates in advance. If you discover there'll be a week with overlapping assignments or multiple tests, you will be better prepared.

Know your school's add/drop dates.

If you think that you may need to drop a class, try to do so during the refund period, and make certain to let your Career and Education Navigator know so they can help you with any concerns along the way.

Take advantage of your tutoring benefit! Setting up a regular tutoring schedule early in the quarter can help to ensure you don't get behind. You qualify for up to four hours a week in fall quarter and that can make a difference! Go to: www.healthcareerfund.org to learn more.

There are many holidays during fall quarter.

Days off during the instructional calendar shouldn't mean taking days off from studying or homework. Regular attendance and correspondence with your instructors during this busy quarter should help keep you on track with your classes and assignments.

Use all of your funding before the end of the year! Remember to submit all of your Training Fund approved education expenses that you have incurred by December 31, 2017! You can also purchase recommended books or software for a class to best utilize all your funds.

It's rewarding to see our hard-working members succeed and further their careers by using the Training Fund.
