Winter Quarter Success Tips

WINTER IS PROGRAM APPLICATION SEASON! HERE ARE SOME TIPS TO HELP YOU SUCCEED.

Stay organized while applying to programs.

Identify which programs you want to apply to and create a folder for each one. Create an application 'checklist' so that you know what materials (transcripts, personal statement, etc.) to include with your application. Also, keep track of each school's application deadline so you apply on time.

If your program deadline is within the next six months, you should allow yourself plenty of time to get started. Requesting transcripts is relatively quick, but writing a quality personal statement is a process that can take months to complete. Set aside time during the quarter to work on and edit your personal statement to make sure you allow time between work and school responsibilities!

Sign up to attend the Training Fund's Personal Statement Workshop. Having a strong personal statement improves your chance of being accepted. This workshop can help you learn:

- Tips and tools to help make your personal statement stand out.
- Effective mechanics of a personal statement.
- How to draft a great personal statement.

Education and Navigation Services Director


