For English language learners (and all students) who wish to utilize speech-to-text, and text-tospeech in their studies, here are two of the more advanced web-based tools in the arena:

1. naturalreaders.com/online (text to speech) is a text-to-speech tool that can be used to have study material read aloud and allows students to listen to their own writing to search for errors.

2. dictation.io – (speech to text) – is great for speaking notes aloud to organize your thoughts, or practice enunciation before a speaking engagement or presentation.

The Spokane Community College Admissions Office helped collaborate with the Training Fund to create a working plan, so that Deb could enter college with her needs and goals prioritized from the start. Deb successfully registered for and used her Tuition Assistance benefit to pay for her first prerequisite class, which began on July 3. Congratulations, Deb!
